



Resolution to Support the myFutureNC Attainment Goal

- WHEREAS, myFutureNC is a statewide non-profit organization focused on educational attainment and is the result of cross-sector collaboration between North Carolina leaders in education, business and government; and
- WHEREAS, The myFutureNC Commission has concluded that North Carolina should have a goal that 2 million North Carolinians will have a high-quality credential or postsecondary degree by 2030; and
- WHEREAS, The Public Schools of Robeson County is committed to keeping the focus of our system on improved student learning, strive to constantly improve our system, bring out the best in people, maintain positive working relationships with all groups, involve people appropriately in the decision-making process, engage our parents and community in the helping deliver a quality education, communicate effectively within the system and our community, honor the diverse backgrounds and needs of the students we serve, encourage creative and efficient use of our resources to support student learning, enhance the capacity of the system to constantly improve itself, ensure that our schools are safe and secure learning and working environments.
