POSTSECONDARY READINESS

Increase Access to Existing Readiness and Remedial Resources for All Qualifying Students by continuing support for Cooperative Innovative High Schools and fully funding online remedial content subscriptions for high schools.

Expand Support for Remedial Instructors by providing funding for a Career & College Ready Graduates effectiveness coordinator.



POSTSECONDARY ACCESS

Expand Access to Postsecondary and Career Advising by strengthening early emphasis on career planning, expanding availability of NC Community College Career Coaches and expanding the presence of the College Advising Corps.

Re-Envision Access to Postsecondary Financial Aid by increasing support for FAFSA completion.



POSTSECONDARY COMPLETION

Reform Public Need-Based Student Aid by consolidating and simplifying public need-based aid grants and updating state grant IT system and outreach efforts.

Strengthen Postsecondary Student Support by expanding financial supports for students most at risk of failing to earn high-value degrees or credentials.



LABOR MARKET ALIGNMENT

Increase Supports for Credentialing Students by expanding enrollment and completion supports already available to degree-seeking students.



POSTSECONDARY FOUNDATIONS

Expand Broadband Access by accelerating support for immediate and longerterm connectivity solutions.
